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WHERE TO STAY AUGUSTUS HOTEL

At the foot of the Apuan Alps, this hotel was once a house that belonged to Augusta Pesenti – the Italian socialite who gave the lodging its name – but opened for guests in 1953.

The main hotel sits alongside the renaissance revivalstyle Villa Agnelli, contemporary La Nave building and seven other villas, offering 106 rooms. Each is a short walk from the hotel's private beach. You can also cast off in one of the boats moored outside or enjoy the Bambaissa restaurant's saffron lobster risotto. "Some of our customers have been coming here for generations we know them all personally," says owner Vittorio Maschietto. "They tell us, 'I'm home now,' when they arrive here." - MSS augustus-hotel.it
